Please email abstracts (100-150 words) to journal@cis-ca.org. Manuscripts should not be sent unless requested. When sending complete manuscripts, please supply the electronic copy (journal@cis-ca.org) along with a double-spaced print version, with diacritics written manually in red. Print all footnotes on the same page where the reference occurs. For non-English words, the journal uses the transliteration system of the *Encyclopaedia of Islam* (new edition) except that “j” is used for *jīm* and “q” for *qāf*. All articles published in the journal are peer reviewed and indexed in major indices. *Islam & Science* seeks articles that interpret, explore and investigate Islamic perspectives on science.
